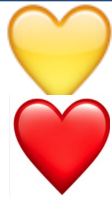

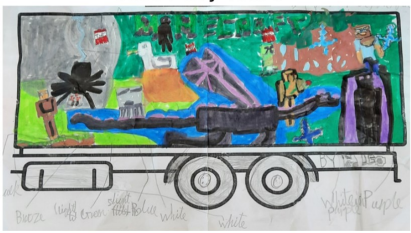
Year 5 trip to Ringwood
