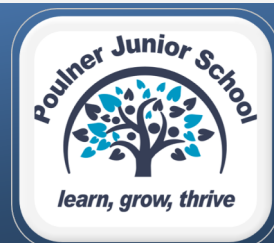

Dear parent, carers

We have had quite an interesting few weeks. I want to firstly thank the children for managing the heat so well this week. The staff have done a wonderful job keeping the classrooms as cool as they can and utilising the grounds and the shade that we have when rooms became too hot. My thanks to parents/carers for your communicating with us so succinctly this week with regards to voluntary collections. Last night I met with Governors and as part of our meeting we discussed who we ensure that the school is adapted for such bouts of heat. It was agreed that it will be wise for us to look to install air conditioning in the upstairs classrooms, so that we can guarantee suitable temperatures for the children to learn well.

I would also like to thank you all for your understanding, due to events being postponed, we have had to amend dates in the diary. I hope that you can see that we are taking our lead from Government and Hampshire advice and the last thing we would want to do is to run a trip or event and put the children at risk, better to be safe than sorry.

I have now written to you to confirm the staffing team ready for September 2026, I am pleased to say that new staff will be joining us on Monday to meet their new class. I am sure that the children will have a very positive day, but as we know nerves can often be high, so we will do our best to reassure them.

As part of our summer preparations we have also had a sort through. We have a number of musical instruments that are looking for a good home! These include guitars, flutes, cellos, clarinets and violins. We are selling them at £10 an instrument, If you would be interested in purchasing any of them then please let us know.

This week we have received the results of the Year 4 Multiplication Check that the children undertook at the start of June. Individual results will be issued with their school reports, but I am delighted to share the results with you. 48% of the children achieved full marks and 82% of the year group scored 21 or more out of the 25 questions. This is a superb result and it puts the children in such a strong position with their learning going into Year 5.

And finally, this year we will be taking part once again in the Ringwood Carnival, application forms for the Royal party are available in the school reception and I can reveal, with excitement that this year the theme of our float will be Toy Story 5! We thought this would be a great theme as there are so many characters that they can dress up as and the message of removing technology from children is a very poignant message for them. On Monday the children will have an assembly to set the scene and to share the float design competition for this year! Get thinking! Have a super weekend.

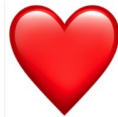

House Captains Community project

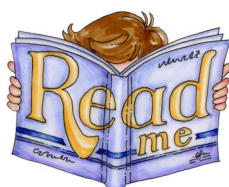

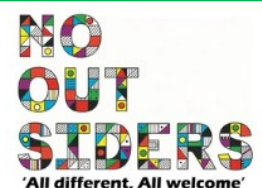
